Cites State Requirements—

Welfare Costs to Stay High, County Aide Says Burglary Probe

CANOGA - Donald Ellis, county welfare commissioner, met with the Seneca County Farm Bureau Welfare committee, the policy execution committee, and directors, Wednesday at the Canoga Community Center.

In explaining the public assistance program, Mr. Ellis stated that under existing state laws and rulings there is no possibility of decreasing the county welfare budget. In fact, considering pay raises and the increasing cost of living, it will more likely continue to in-

At present the county welfare budget is approximately 40 per cent of the total county budget.

Mr. Ellis suggested that the Farm Bureau might help by working for legislation to make indirect payments permissable. Under this system, the welfare department would pay the recipients' bills at the grocery stores, etc. instead of giving the recipient the money.






